





#### DATES TO REMEMBER

#### Sunday, November 30 No classes, Thanksgiving holiday

An elderly priest tells the story about a class reunion where he found himself surrounded by several of the students he had taught. Most of them he had not seen in years and it was obvious that they had great respect for him.

Each one of them shared what they had been doing. One was an architect who had built a number of public buildings, including two churches. Another was a university professor who had written several books. Another was the head of a global company. Another was a highly successful farmer. Another was the principal of a prestigious school.

The elderly priest listened with pleasure to the impressive litany of successes and achievements. There didn't seem to be a single failure among them.

When they had finished telling their stories; he complimented them on their achievements. Then, looking at them with affection, he said, "And now, tell me what you have made of yourselves?"

A long silence followed. They were reluctant to talk about their personal lives. It seems that they were so absorbed in their careers that they had neglected their personal lives. Their energies were so focused on efficiency and success that they didn't have the time to grow emotionally, with the result that in terms of relationships many of them were impoverished.

People may have done great things in their public lives but failed in their private lives. Most people who are successful at their careers leave their personal lives a long way behind. Unfortunately, their successes are often achieved at the expence of their personal lives.

In last Sunday's Gospel, Christ talks about three people who were given different talents. He commends the first two because they used their talents, and he chastises the third because he buried his talent.

When Jesus speaks about talents, he is not talking about musical gifts or being good at sports. Such talents are important but Christ's parable goes much deeper. Ultimately, the only thing that matters is what we make of ourselves.

As Pope St. John Paul II said, "What really matters in life is that we are loved by Christ and that we love him in return. In comparison to the love of Jesus, everything else is secondary. And, without the love of Jesus, everything else is useless."

Life is God's gift to us. What we do with life is our gift to God.



Pope Francis has called for a special year-long focus on consecrated life, asking the church's religious sisters, brothers and priests to "wake up the world" with their testimony of faith, holiness and hope. He will open the year with a celebration in Rome on the First Sunday of Advent, November 30, 2014. The Diocese of Tucson joins Pope Francis and the Church throughout the world affirming Consecrated Religious throughout this time designated as the *Year of Consecrated Life*. Events will be sponsored throughout the year for the renewal of religious life, for the celebration of the witness of members of religious orders and as an invitation to young people to consider a religious vocation.

Bishop Gerald F. Kicanas will inaugurate the year in our Diocese with a special Liturgy at St. Augustine's Cathedral on December 14, 2014 at 10:00 A.M.
