DATES TO REMEMBER

December 21 - December 28 No classes, Christmas break

As Advent began we heard the Gospel story about the householder who had a number of servants. Before leaving on a trip abroad, he called them together and gave each one a job. He urged them to be responsible saying, "When I return I want to find you awake." He singled out the doorkeeper for a special warning.

The parable ends there with a firm warning ringing in our ears. Let us take it a little further, concentrating on the doorkeeper. Perhaps the greatest danger facing him is not so much that he may fall asleep on the job, as that he may grow accustomed to it.

The doorkeeper feels honored that the boss chose him and placed so much trust in him. But as time goes on, the opening and closing of the door can become monotonous, even boring. The novelty of the position wears off. Slowly but surely the dust of habit accumulates on him and his world. A deadly routine takes over. He is still responsible, still unfailingly at his post. But he is merely going through the motions. The initial love and enthusiasm have faded away. His heart is no longer in it. When the Master returns he will undoubtedly find him at his post, awake, but not alive

Habit gradually deadens us and in the end snuffs out all life. We grow comfortable in ruts of tradition and conformity. We sit in our armchair becoming oblivious to what is going on around us.

What happens in ordinary life happens in our spiritual life too. We can get into a deadly routine with the result we are Christians by habit only. We are merely going through the motions. We are taking part in rituals that have lost freshness and meaning. We don't hear the Gospel anymore. It just goes in one ear and out the other. The face of Christ has vanished from our sight. So what is the solution? We need to be disturbed from time to time. This is where the season of Advent comes in. Advent issues a great "wake up" call to us. It provides us with an opportunity to shake off the dust of habit, and to let Christ come alive in our lives once again.

The Lord is coming. He will come to each one of us at the moment of death, and to the world at the end of time. We don't know the day or the hour of his coming. Any time is the wrong time for the unfaithful servant. But any time is the right time for the faithful servant. The faithful servant does not fear the Masters return, but welcomes it. We have to be prepared, awake and ready by being alive, alert, responsible servants of the Lord and of one another. May this Advent season be a time of grace and new growth for each one of us.
