



DATES TO REMEMBER

February 18- Ash Wednesday Fast and Abstinence

One of the most stinging words that we can use to describe another human being is disgusting. Here are two reasons why this word stings.

First, the word disgusting stings badly because it expresses revulsion. It is one thing to say that a smell is disgusting or a certain behavior is disgusting. But when you label a human being as disgusting, you express revulsion for one of God's most precious creatures.

Second, the word disgusting stings badly because it is usually spoken with a force that borders on hatred. The lesson in today's Gospel is about accepting and reaching out to those whom society might consider disgusting.

You can better understand what this lesson means for you today if you understand how disgusting the disease of leprosy was in Jesus' day. A person with leprosy smelled terrible; rotting skin stinks. The person would be very hard to look at; leprosy disfigures the human body, leaving sores and resulting in missing fingers or toes or facial features and other areas of the body. The culture of Jesus day forbade exchanges with those who had leprosy but that was not a hard rule to follow because no one wanted to be near a person with the disease.

Today's Gospel tells us to identify people today who are like those with leprosy in Jesus' day; those who are considered disgusting. Now this is not about disease only. There are many things about people that today's culture shuns and finds disgusting.

Once you identify those who might be considered the people with leprosy today, you are to respond just as Jesus did: with compassion, stretching out your hands, touching and helping.





Forgiveness


A Lenten Parish Mission
