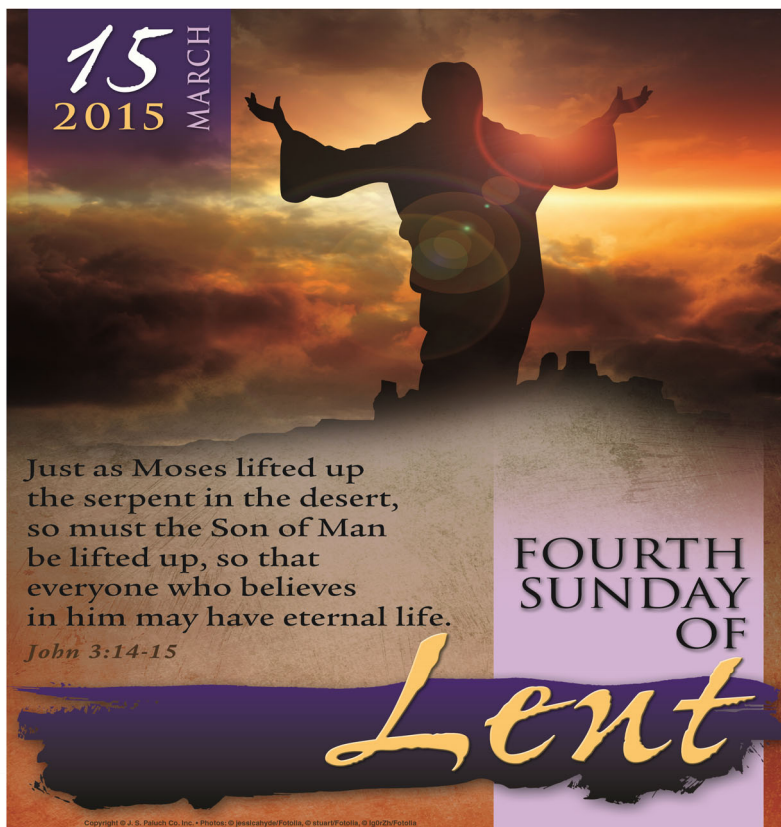

### **Good Friday Outdoor Stations**



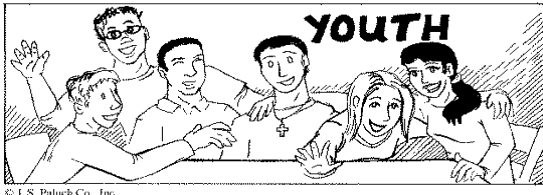

## DATES TO REMEMBER

Insects and flies are lured by the scent of the sweet. Many times they  
 discover that following a sweet scent can lead to a life of imprisonment or  
 worse. Unable to resist the lure of the scent, they crawl far into a flower  
 only to get so steeped in pollen that they cannot get out.

We might think that this could never happen to human beings. After all, we  
 are rational creatures, too smart to fall for that. The sad reality is that we  
 do allow it to happen. Like the bees we are lured by the scent of the  
 sweet.

Temptation is all about enticing a person to do wrong. When we think of  
 temptations, we immediately think of bad things. However, it is not only  
 evil that can lead us to fall into sin. Good can do so just as effectively. All  
 temptation comes under the disguise of good. The strength of the  
 temptation is in proportion to the attractiveness of the goal.

We must keep in mind that it is not only when the path is difficult and filled  
 with obstacles that we fail to reach the goal, but also when it is littered with  
 things that attract us. We allow ourselves to be sidetracked. Earthly food  
 dulls our appetite for heavenly food. The Gospel gives us many examples.  
 When Jesus visited the home of Martha and Mary, Martha was too busy to  
 listen to him. It wasn't something bad which kept her from listening. It was  
 something good and even praiseworthy, the details of hospitality. However,  
 she missed out on the opportunity to be spiritually fed by the Master.

Jesus told a parable about guests who refused an invitation to a banquet.  
 In refusing they were not acting from bad motives, but from perfectly good  
 ones. One man wanted to inspect a piece of land he had purchased.

Another wanted to try out some oxen he had bought. A third was newly  
 married. Even though their reasons for staying away were valid, the effect  
 was the same as if they had been vile-they allowed the banquet to pass  
 them by. In his parable of the sower, Jesus said that some of the seed was  
 choked by thorns. What did these "thorns" consist of? The worries and  
 cares of the world and the lure of riches. Again, things not evil in  
 themselves but things that can detract us from the goal.

What do we learn from all of this? That we may have as much to fear from  
 the good as from the bad. We are repulsed by something that is manifestly  
 evil. But we also must be careful of things that we see as manifestly good.  
 The Devil does not appear as a repulsive character. He appears to us as  
 an attractive, ingratiating, charming character, even a friend. He appears  
 to have your best interests at heart, as when he offered Jesus bread and  
 all the kingdoms of the world. We need to ask God daily for the wisdom  
 and strength to be able to resist temptations, especially those that come  
 under the disguise of being good.
