



Wednesday, February 10- Ash Wednesday, Fast and Abstinence **Sunday, February 14** – No Class, President's Day

Today we celebrate the feast of St. John Bosco. (1815-1888). John Bosco was ordained in 1841. His service to young people began when he met a poor orphan and instructed him in preparation for receiving Holy Communion. He served as chaplain in a hospice for working girls and then opened the Oratory of St. Francis DeSales for boys. Several wealthy patrons contributed money, enabling him to provide two workshops for boys, shoemaking and tailoring. By 1856, the Oratory had grown to 150 boys and had added a printing press for publication of religious and catechetical pamphlets. Because of these endeavors John Bosco has become the patron of young apprentices and Catholic publishers.

With Pope Pius IX's encouragement, John founded the Salesians in 1859. Their activity concentrated on education and mission work. Later, he organized a group of Salesian Sisters to assist girls. John Bosco educated the whole person-body and soul united. He

believed that Christ's love and our belief in that love should pervade everything we do, work, study and play. For John Bosco, being a Christian was a full time effort, not a once a week, Mass on Sunday experience. It is searching and finding God and Jesus in everything we do, letting their love lead us. Yet, John recognized the importance of job training and the self worth and pride that comes with talent and ability so he trained hi students in the trade crafts too.
