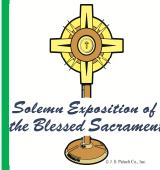

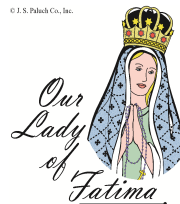

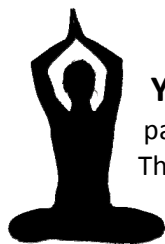

The Penitential Observance of Lent

Historical Background

Even by the time of Christ, fasting and abstaining were venerable traditions among the Jews. The practices were not foreign to Christ or the apostles. In the early church, a two or three day Lenten fast was common. It was not until the fourth century and the Council of Nicea in A.D. 325 that a forty day period was mentioned. In the Middle Ages, the rule relaxed somewhat, with a light second meal and fish allowed. From time to time and place to place, there has been a variation in practice, but consistency of spirit: the life of a Christian is a life of penance.

Current Practice:

1. The days of penance to be observed are Ash Wednesday and all Fridays during Lent.
2. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence.
3. All Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence (no meat) only.
4. The Law of Abstinence obliges all those who have reached their 14th year.
5. The law of fast (only one full meal each day, nothing between meals, liquids allowed,) obliges those who have reached their 18th year until the beginning of their 60th year.
6. The substantial observance of these laws is a grave obligation.

The Name of God is Mercy (Pope Francis)

Where does God meet ordinary people like you and me? Where do ordinary people living ordinary everyday lives meet God?

When God became a human being, Jesus of Nazareth, he met people where they worked, like Simon Peter and his friends who made a living as fishermen. He met Matthew who made his living by collecting taxes. While resting next to a well, Jesus met a woman going there for water and spoke to her about everything she had ever done. Lepers came to him to be healed. A blind man cried out to Jesus "I want to see," and Jesus healed him. He healed a paralyzed man as he forgave his sins, and changed water into wine at a wedding celebration.

Jesus was a man of God's mercy and compassion who fed over 5000 hungry people with a few loaves of bread and some fish. They couldn't get food for themselves. Jesus is the visible expression on earth of God's mercy. He manifested this mercy in his deep compassion for others. He could feel what they felt because he was a human God: a God who wept and suffered with them. When he died on a cross he offered mercy and forgiveness to all, even those who were killing him. When he rose from the dead, he returned to his disciples who had abandoned him, offering them God's mercy with his first words: "Peace to you." Then he called them to forgive others, offering them God's peace just as they had been forgiven.

The name of God is mercy. Jesus brings that mercy to us today because he still is human and divine. He offers this mercy daily in your ordinary lives and now in a special way during this Parish Mission of God's Mercy, and the 25th anniversary of Our Lady of the Mountains Church.

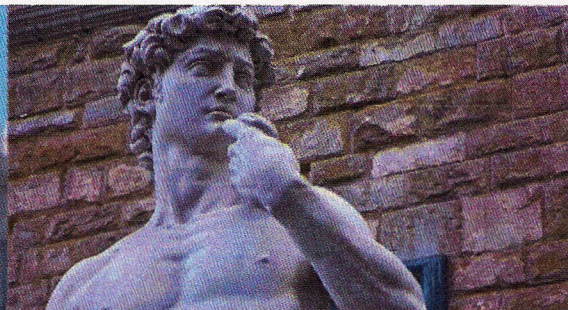
