


Youthfest will be held March 11th and 12th at the Tucson convention center. Please submit your registration forms soon. It's a wonderful opportunity to grow in your faith.

Next Week's Gospel Preparation 3rd Sunday in Lent, Luke 13: 1-19 Tempered With Humility

February 28

Why does fasting matter? I am sure you have heard that prayer, fasting, and almsgiving are long standing practices in our Catholic faith, frequently cited throughout the centuries as means to deepen our spiritual life.(CCC1438, for more info) Many Christian writers and saints have offered descriptions of how acts of self-sacrifice can be helpful to the soul. Why do they argue that something as simple as giving up video games can make a difference in your life? The reason is quite simple: Self-denial helps us get somewhere. A couple of illustrations might help.

Jarrod plays the tenor drums in the marching band .Every fall he practices with the band for two and a half hours, twice a week. He attends special all day sessions, takes private lessons, and takes part in competitions and shows on weekends. He sacrifices the weekend trips to the movies and playing video games with his friends. He gives those up to hone his skills as part of something bigger than himself: a close- knit group of musicians who develop a remarkable show together.

Hannah has never run competitively before. She wants to run in the Boston Marathon. She quickly discovers that she will never realize this dream if she stays at the same level as when she ran on her college track team. With the help of a mentor who has run the race, she learns the art of long distance running. On Saturdays she replaces her morning leisure over a good book and a cup of tea with pounding the pavement and gradually developing longer and longer runs. She suffers with sore joints, achy muscles and the cost of many pair of shoes on the way to her first marathon.

Spiritual sacrifices throughout Lent and the rest of the year lead us to something even deeper than a fantastic concert or successful marathon. Our goal is heaven and spiritual communion with our God. Every spiritual sacrifice helps us to focus our energies on someone greater than ourselves. The message is summed up in Romans 12:1-2: "I urge you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to offer your bodies as living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God, your spiritual worship. Do not conform yourselves to this age but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and pleasing and perfect." CARDIOVASCULAR SCREENINGS

HEART ULTRASOUND

Screening visualizes the heart valves, measures systolic function, the motility of the left ventricle, ejection fraction and dimensions of the atrium and ventricles.
