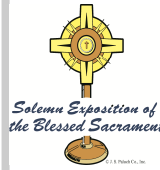

STRENGTHENING THE CHURCH AT HOME



The Church has great needs around the world, and the United States is no exception.

Many dioceses here at home face challenges due to priest shortages, lack of funds, remote geography, or impoverished parishes. The Catholic Home Missions Appeal answers these needs and provides grants for projects to strengthen the faith of the people. Forty-two percent of all dioceses in the United States receive Catholic Home Missions support for evangelization, catechesis, ministry formation, and other areas of faith development. Your support of this collection will continue to help your neighbors here in the United States and strengthen the Church at home.

The population within the Diocese of El Paso in West Texas is 80% Catholic, one of the highest percentages of Catholics of any diocese in the United States, and more than two-thirds are Hispanic. However, the rural parishes experience poverty, extreme geographic isolation, and rugged terrain. Through a grant from Catholic Home Missions, two Missionary Sisters of Jesus have served five parishes, six missions, and nearly 4,000 Catholics through the West Texas Evangelization Program (WTEP). These two sisters are the only presence of consecrated women in the

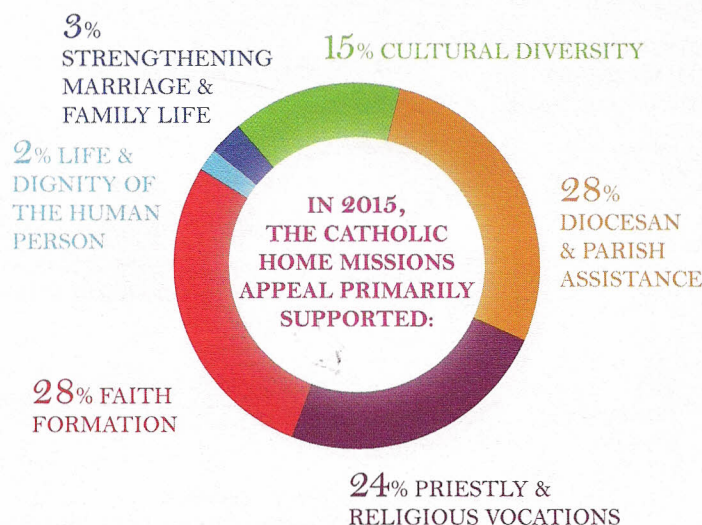
area, and with the shortage of priests, they do much to help strengthen the local Catholic communities.

Through WTEP, the sisters have helped form small faith-sharing groups, conducted Lenten missions, and made door-to-door visits in the neighborhoods. They have encouraged parishioners to live out the works of mercy by visiting those confined to their homes and ministering to those in prison as well as their families. Even when prisoners are moved, the sisters continue to provide outreach through letter writing. WTEP also brought medical professionals to provide much-needed health and wellness presentations to these rural communities, which otherwise lack access to these resources.

In the Pacific Ocean, between Guam and Hawaii, are the Marshall Islands, a collection of atolls and islands covering an area of 500,000 square miles. Given the great distance between these islands, travel is often difficult and communication is unreliable. In addition, because not all the islands are able to have a resident priest, the Church in the Marshall Islands relies on prayer leaders to lead the Sunday liturgy of Scripture reading and reflection as well as distribution of Communion. These prayer leaders are required to attend a yearly training and retreat, and all new leaders are guided by experienced prayer leaders. Thanks to a grant from Catholic Home Missions, the Marshall Islands were able to host this training again and bring in the same presenters from the previous year, providing for continuity and familiarity. At the closing ceremony, many of the participants could not contain their feelings of joy and appreciation.

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Strengthening the Church at Home

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FORTALECIENDO LA IGLESIA EN CASA



La Iglesia tiene grandes necesidades en todo el mundo y, en los Estados Unidos, no somos la excepción. Muchas diócesis, aquí en casa, enfrentan desafíos debido a la escasez de sacerdotes, la falta de fondos, por estar geográficamente distantes o por tener parroquias pobres. El Llamado para las Misiones Católicas responde a estas necesidades y otorga donaciones a proyectos que fortalecen la fe de la gente. El cuarenta y dos por ciento de todas las diócesis en los Estados Unidos recibe apoyo financiero del Llamado para las Misiones Católicas para la evangelización, la catequesis, la formación en el ministerio, y para otras áreas de formación en la fe. Al apoyar a esta colecta, ustedes ayudarán a sus vecinos aquí en los Estados Unidos y fortalecerán la Iglesia en casa.

La población en la Diócesis de El Paso, en la zona oeste de Texas, es 80% católica, uno de los porcentajes más altos de cualquier diócesis en los Estados Unidos y más de dos tercios son hispanos. No obstante, las parroquias rurales experimentan la pobreza, un gran aislamiento geográfico y tienen terrenos accidentados. Gracias a una donación de las Misiones Católicas, dos misioneras Hermanas de Jesús han prestado servicios en cinco parroquias, seis misiones y a casi 4,000 católicos, por medio del West Texas Evangelization Program (WTEP). Estas dos

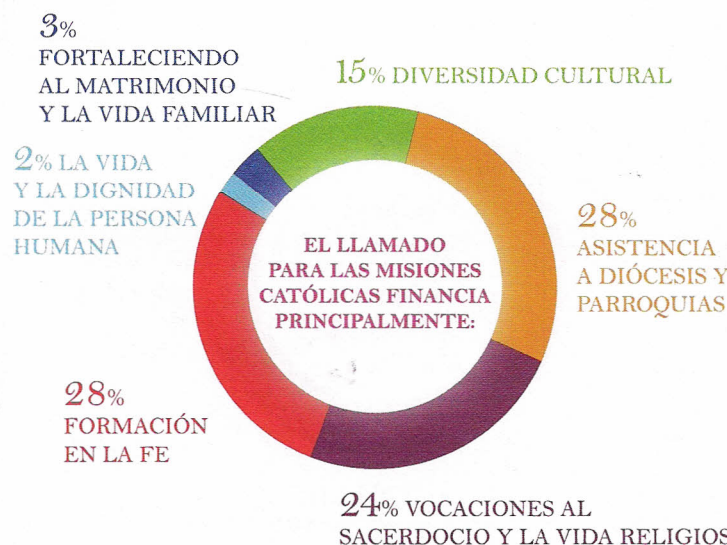
hermanas son la única presencia de mujeres consagradas en esa zona y, con la escasez de sacerdotes, ellas hacen mucho para ayudar a fortalecer a las comunidades católicas locales.

Por medio de WTEP, las hermanas han ayudado a formar grupos pequeños para compartir la fe, han llevado a cabo misiones en Cuaresma y han visitado a sus vecinos, de casa en casa. Han alentado a los feligreses a realizar obras piadosas al visitar a personas confinadas en su hogar y a realizar su ministerio con las personas que están en prisión y con sus familias. Aun cuando los prisioneros son llevados a otro lugar, las hermanas continúan brindándoles apoyo escribiéndoles cartas. WTEP también llevó a profesionales médicos para que hicieran unas presentaciones muy necesarias sobre la salud y el bienestar a estas comunidades, las cuales, de otro modo, no tendrían acceso a estos recursos.

En el Océano Pacífico, entre Guam y Hawái, se encuentran las Islas Marshall, una colección de atolones y de islas que cubre un área de 500,000 millas cuadradas. Dada la gran distancia que existe entre estas islas, los viajes se hacen difíciles y la comunicación no es fiable. Además, debido a que no todas las islas cuentan con un sacerdote residente, la Iglesia en las Islas Marshall confía en que los líderes de la oración dirijan la liturgia dominical con la lectura de las Escrituras y la reflexión, así como la distribución de la Comunión. A estos líderes de la oración se les exige que asistan anualmente a una capacitación y a un retiro y todos los nuevos líderes son guiados por líderes de la oración con experiencia. Gracias a una donación de las Misiones Católicas, las Islas Marshall pudieron ofrecer nuevamente esta capacitación e invitar a los mismos presentadores que estuvieron el año anterior, brindando así continuidad y familiaridad. En la ceremonia de clausura, muchos de los participantes no pudieron contener sus sentimientos de alegría y aprecio.

Por medio de sus donativos, las misiones en El Paso y en las Islas Marshall recibirán los recursos que ellas necesitan para ofrecerles apoyo a sus parroquias y fortalecer la Iglesia en casa. *“Over and above such outstanding moments, there is an everyday heroism, made up of gestures of sharing, big and small, which build up an authentic culture of life. A particularly praiseworthy example of such gestures is the **donation of organs**,...with a view to offering the chance of health and even life to sick who sometimes have no hope.”*

Facts about Organ and Tissue Donation

FACT: It's a federal crime to buy or sell organs and tissues. Race, gender, income or celebrity status are never considered in determining who receives an organ. Organ allocation is based on factors including blood type, length of time on a waiting list, geographical location, severity of illness or other medical criteria.

FACT: Doctors who treat patients at the time of death have nothing to do with donation or transplantation of their organs and tissues. Every effort is made to save the patient's life before donation can be considered.

FACT: There is no cost to be a donor. Donation is a gift. Any costs for transplantation are the recipient's cost.

FACT: Studies show that donation most often provides immediate and long-term consolation. Donation can especially
