

Help Release Souls from Purgatory

"I believe . . . in the communion of saints." These words are said when we pray the Apostles Creed. Who are these saints? They are those welcomed into God's perfect love, Heaven; the holy souls in Purgatory undergoing purification needed before entering Heaven; those of us on earth journeying to achieve the holiness to enter Heaven. We are eternally bound together in the Body of Christ through intercessions, prayer, suffering, and charitable acts to bring all into the kingdom of God.

In November we focus on remembering the souls of our departed loved ones. They can do nothing for their own release from Purgatory. but we can. The Catechism of the Catholic Church #1032 states "The Church also commends almsgiving, indulgences, and works of penance undertaken on behalf of the dead. . . Let us not hesitate to help those who have died and to offer our prayers for them."

During November form the habit of helping the holy souls gain Heaven by performing any actions listed below. They are taken from *Day by Day for the Holy Souls in Purgatory, 365 Reflections* by Susan Tassone, published by Our Sunday Visitor.

- 1. Help those in need that God puts in your life for the sake of the suffering souls. (23)
- 2. "At the Consecration of the Mass, lift up these mournful souls." (31)
- 3. Offer Masses for members of your family tree. If possible, offer Gregorian Masses. (51)
- 4. "Invoke God's mercy for those who will die alone." (106)
- 5. "The most abandoned souls are clergy and consecrated religious. Recite seven Our Fathers, Hail Marys, and Glory Be's to obtain their pardon." (113)
- 6. "The holy souls are concerned about their loved ones' salvation. They reach out to help those who are still on earth. . . Today, work at developing a deeper appreciation for these great intercessors. (140)
- 7. "A popular indulgenced prayer is the Eternal Rest Prayer. Be fervent in praying it throughout the day." Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen. (173) (An indulgence is partial or plenary according as it removes either part or all of the temporal punishment due to sin. The faithful can gain indulgences for themselves or apply them to the dead. Catechism of the Catholic Church n. 1471)
- 8. Make the Way of the Cross for souls of family and friends. . . "The holy wounds of Jesus are the treasure of treasures for the holy souls." (179)
- 9. "Ask the holy souls to help you determine a specific virtue you need to develop in honor of them." (186)
- 10. "Urge another to join in praying the Rosary for the holy souls. It is the most powerful Marian prayer on earth." (236)
- 11. Teach the younger generations about the holy souls. Bring them to the cemetery on a Saturday. Pray the Eternal Rest Prayer (#7 above) and have them sprinkle holy water on the graves. (268)
- 12. "The prison of purgatory is one of our own making. The fire is the longing to be in the presence of the Lord. The key to release is prayer. Pray for those suffering souls whose own prayers can no longer help bring them to the Love they so intensely desire." (304)
