Why Should I Stay Until The End of Mass?

Communion is not the end of Mass. In fact, the time of meditation and prayer following Communion should be one of the most important moments for us within the Mass, and even our entire week. The Eucharistic meditation provides us with unrivaled intimacy and spiritual communion. In addition, the final blessing after Communion confers grace upon us that we will need during the week to live out the challenges the Scripture readings and homily have just given us. The recessional song at the end of Mass is a wonderful opportunity to raise our voices and celebrate God's greatness and love one last time. Out of respect, we should wait to leave until the priest and ministers have left the sanctuary and processed out. There is also a rich symbolism here of "following Christ out into the world." In short, if we really understood what is transpiring at Mass, we would not be in such a hurry to leave. We would embrace every minute and every chance we have to stay in God's Eucharistic presence, surrounded by our fellow Christians. Those who regularly leave Mass early probably do not really understand and appreciate the great gift they have just been a part of. Your prayerful example of remaining until after the priest and ministers have left the sanctuary will be an example to others, inspiring them to take a second look at their own practice.

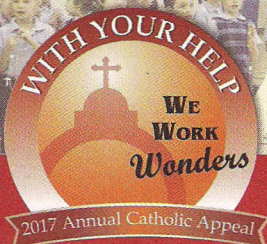

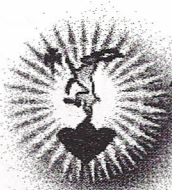

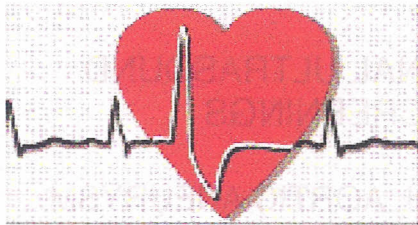

CARDIOVASCULAR SCREENINGS

HEART ULTRASOUND
