



Imagínese una situación tan peligrosa que usted necesita huir de su hogar con su familia hacia un país desconocido. ¿Qué cosas traería con usted? ¿Dónde viviría? ;A cuál escuela asistirían sus hijos?

Jordania, país limítrofe con Siria, es el hogar de más de 600,000 refugiados sirios; más de la mitad de éstos son niños. Y esas son las preguntas que los padres de familia se hacen a diario.
