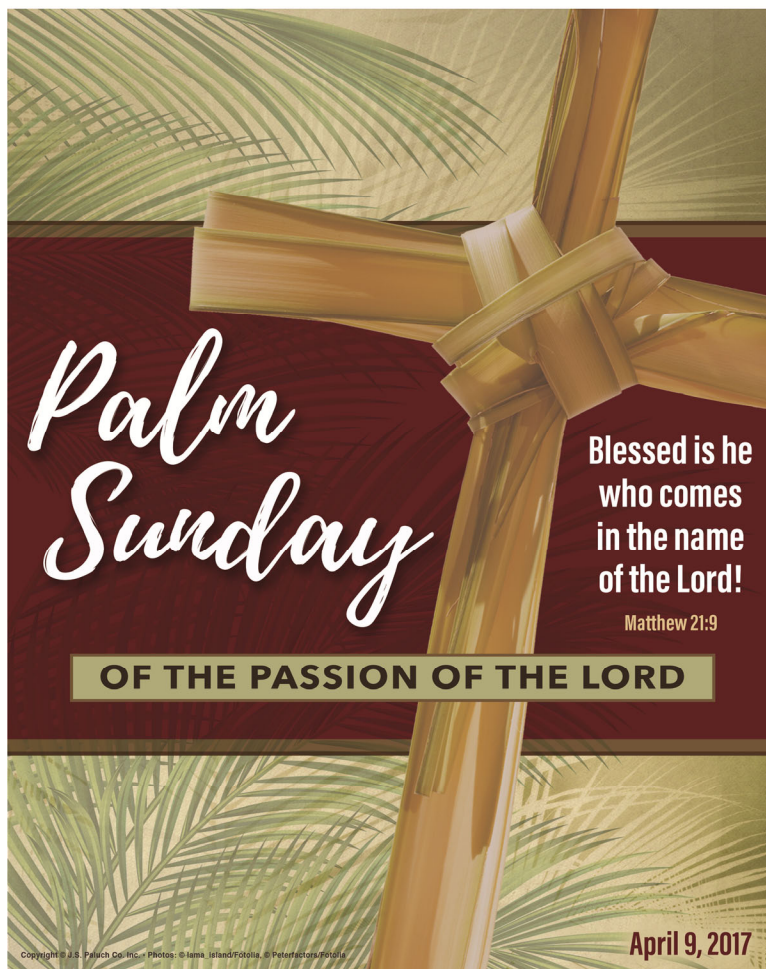

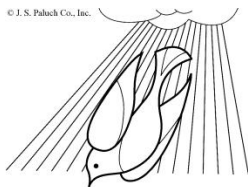

Next Week's Gospel Preparation
Easter Sunday, John 20: 1-9
Witness to Faith

This week, beginning with Palm Sunday, is traditionally called Holy Week. It is, indeed, the holiest week of the church year. We continue to observe Lent until the beginning of the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Thursday which is the start of the Triduum. The first day of the Triduum is from Holy Thursday sunset until Good Friday sunset. It is the day of Jesus' death. It includes the liturgies of "The Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper," and "The Celebration of The Lord's Passion" on Good Friday. The second day of the Triduum is from Good Friday at sunset until Holy Saturday sunset., is the Paschal Sabbath, the day of rest. In burial, the Lord rested, and we rest in him. The third day of the Triduum begins Holy Saturday at sunset and is the great surprise, the Easter Surprise. This third day begins with the holiest night of the year, the Vigil of Easter. Easter Sunday services are the Easter Vigil, Easter Sunday Services during the night and Easter Sunday. The Great Feast of Easter is sustained for fifty days!

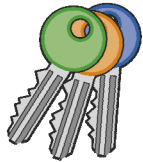

Domingo de Palmas – 9 de abril 2017

Él entra humildemente y se proclama como su rey, y luego, a medida que escuchamos la Pasión de acuerdo a San Mateo, vemos ¡cómo se entrega a la traición, la captura, el castigo y a la muerte por nosotros!

- ¿Cómo puedo ser un apoyo fiel para mi prójimo sin traicionarlo o traicionarla?
- ¿Con quién / quiénes debo caminar en esta Semana Santa y de qué manera seré yo las manos y los pies de Cristo para ellos?



"Turn to my mercy". . . words spoken by Jesus in private revelations to a simple, humble nun, Sister Mary Faustina Kowalska, during the 1930's in Poland. As an uneducated, sickly nun, she humbly performed her convent chores of cook, gardener, and gatekeeper. She had frequent mystical experiences during which Jesus invited her to announce anew the gospel message of God's mercy.

Jesus requested His desire that His Divine Mercy be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. **"On that day I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon souls who approach the fount of mercy."**

In preparation for the Feast of Divine Mercy, Jesus requested confession, communion and a novena of prayers beginning Good Friday and ending on the Feast. **"You will recite it for nine days on the beads of the rosary . . ."**

"On each day you will bring to my heart a different group of souls and you will immerse them in this ocean of my mercy. On each day you beg my father for the strength of my bitter passion, for graces for these souls."

Reciting the Divine Mercy Chaplet

Our Lord taught Sister Faustina a prayer for mercy that she was to pray "unceasingly."

We too can pray this chaplet, using ordinary rosary beads of the five decades. We begin with the Our Father, Hail Mary and the Apostles Creed.

On the bead before each decade, pray: Eternal Father, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

On the "Hail Mary" beads, pray: For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

After five decades, pray 3 times: Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

The Novena to The Divine Mercy

FIRST DAY

Today bring to Me all mankind, especially all sinner and immerse them in the ocean of My mercy.

Most Merciful Jesus, whose very nature it is to have compassion on us and to forgive us, do not look upon our sins but upon our trust which we place in Your infinite goodness. Receive us all into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart, and never let us escape from It. We beg this of You by Your love which unites You to the Father and the Holy Spirit.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon all mankind and especially upon poor sinners, all enfolded in the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. For the sake of His sorrowful Passion show us Your mercy that we may praise the omnipotence of Your mercy forever and ever. Amen.

SECOND DAY

Today bring to Me the souls of priests and religious, and immerse them in My unfathomable mercy.

Most Merciful Jesus, from whom comes all that is good, increase Your grace in men and women consecrated to Your service, that they may perform worthy works of mercy; and that all who see them may glorify the Father of Mercy who is in heaven.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon the company of chosen ones in Your vineyard — upon the souls of priests and religious; and endow them with the strength of Your blessing. For the love of the Heart of Your Son in which they are enfolded, impart to them Your power and light, that they may be able to guide others in the way of salvation and with one voice sing praise to Your boundless mercy for ages without end. Amen.

THIRD DAY

Today bring to Me all devout and faithful souls, and immerse them in the ocean of My mercy.

Most Merciful Jesus, from the treasury of Your mercy, You impart Your graces in great abundance to each and all. Receive us into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart and never let us escape from It. We beg this grace of You by that most wondrous love for the heavenly Father with which Your Heart burns so fiercely.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon faithful souls, as upon the inheritance of Your Son. For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, grant them Your blessing and surround them with Your constant protection. Thus may they never fail in love or lose the treasure of the holy faith, but rather, with all the hosts of Angels and Saints, may they glorify Your boundless mercy for endless ages. Amen.

FOURTH DAY

Today bring to Me those who do not believe in God and those who do not yet know Me.

Most compassionate Jesus, You are the Light of the whole world. Receive into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart the souls of those who do not believe in God and of those who as yet do not know You. Let the rays of Your grace enlighten them that they, too, together with us, may extol Your wonderful mercy; and do not let them escape from the abode which is Your Most Compassionate Heart.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon the souls of those who do not believe in You, and of those who as yet do not know You, but who are enclosed in the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. Draw them to the light of the Gospel. These souls do not know what great happiness it is to love You. Grant that they, too, may extol the generosity of Your mercy for endless ages. Amen.

FIFTH DAY

Today bring to Me the souls of those who have separated themselves from the Church.

Most Merciful Jesus, Goodness Itself, You do not refuse light to those who seek it of You. Receive into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart the souls of those who have separated themselves from Your Church. Draw them by Your light into the unity of the Church, and do not let them escape from the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart; but bring it about that they, too, come to glorify the generosity of Your mercy.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon the souls of those who have separated themselves from Your Son's Church, who have squandered Your blessings and misused Your graces by obstinately persisting in their errors. Do not look upon their errors, but upon the love of Your own Son and upon His bitter Passion, which He underwent for their sake, since they, too, are enclosed in His Most Compassionate Heart. Bring it about that they also may glorify Your great mercy for endless ages. Amen.

SIXTH DAY

Today bring to Me the meek and humble souls and the souls of little children, and immerse them in My mercy.

Most Merciful Jesus, You yourself have said, "Learn from Me for I am meek and humble of heart." Receive into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart all meek and humble souls and the souls of little children. These souls send all heaven into ecstasy and they are the heavenly Father's favorites. They are a sweet-smelling bouquet before the throne of God; God himself takes delight in their fragrance. These souls have a permanent abode in Your Most Compassionate Heart, O Jesus, and they unceasingly sing out a hymn of love and mercy.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon meek souls, upon humble souls, and upon little children who are enfolded in the abode which is the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. These souls bear the closest resemblance to Your Son. Their fragrance rises from the earth and reaches Your very throne. Father of mercy and of all goodness, I beg You by the love You bear these souls and by the delight You take in them: Bless the whole world, that all souls together may sing out the praises of Your mercy for endless ages. Amen.

SEVENTH DAY

Today bring to Me the souls who especially venerate and glorify My Mercy and immerse them in My mercy.

Most Merciful Jesus, whose Heart is Love Itself, receive into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart the souls of those who particularly extol and venerate the greatness of Your mercy. These souls are mighty with the very power of God Himself. In the midst of all afflictions and adversities they go forward, confident of Your mercy; and united to You, O Jesus, they carry all mankind on their shoulders. These souls will not be judged severely, but Your mercy will embrace them as they depart from this life.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon the souls who glorify and venerate Your greatest attribute, that of Your fathomless mercy, and who are enclosed in the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. These souls are a living Gospel; their hands are full of deeds of mercy, and their hearts, overflowing with joy, sing a canticle of mercy to You, O Most High! I beg You O God: Show them Your mercy according to the hope and trust they have placed in You. Let there be accomplished in them the promise of Jesus, who said to them that during their life, but especially at the hour of death, the souls who will venerate this fathomless mercy of His, He, Himself, will defend as His glory. Amen.

EIGHTH DAY

Today bring to Me the souls who are detained in purgatory and immerse them in the abyss of My mercy.

Most Merciful Jesus, You Yourself have said that You desire mercy; so I bring into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart the souls in Purgatory, souls who are very dear to You; and yet, who must make retribution to Your justice. May the streams of Blood and Water which gushed forth from Your Heart put out the flames of Purgatory, that there, too, the power of Your mercy may be celebrated.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon the souls suffering in Purgatory, who are enfolded in the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. I beg You, by the sorrowful Passion of Jesus Your Son, and by all the bitterness with which His most sacred Soul was flooded: Manifest Your mercy to the souls who are under Your just scrutiny. Look upon them in no other way but only through the Wounds of Jesus, Your dearly beloved Son; for we firmly believe that there is no limit to Your goodness and compassion. Amen.

NINTH DAY

Today bring to Me souls who have become lukewarm, and immerse them in the abyss of My mercy.

Most compassionate Jesus, You are Compassion Itself. I bring lukewarm souls into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart. In this fire of Your pure love let these tepid souls, who, like corpses, filled You with such deep loathing, be once again set aflame. O Most Compassionate Jesus, exercise the omnipotence of Your mercy and draw them into the very ardor of Your love, and bestow upon them the gift of holy love, for nothing is beyond Your power.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon lukewarm souls who are nonetheless enfolded in the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. Father of Mercy, I beg You by the bitter Passion of Your Son and by His three-hour agony on the Cross: Let them, too, glorify the abyss of Your mercy. Amen.

STRENGTHENING THE CHURCH AT HOME

The Diocese of Knoxville in eastern Tennessee is a largely rural diocese that bears the face of the rural poor. The Hispanic population has more than doubled in the last few years and poverty disproportionately affects this community.

Through your support of the Catholic Home Missions Appeal (CHMA), the diocese is expanding its Hispanic ministry programs. With your contributions, it is distributing prayer cards, providing Hispanic leadership training and faith formation, and increasing the number of parishes celebrating Mass in Spanish in order to help integrate and retain this population. One parish only held Mass monthly and attendance was a low 20-50 people, but staff recognized the large Hispanic community there and the need

for a Spanish Mass. A priest travels 60 miles each Sunday to celebrate Mass in Spanish, and attendance has nearly doubled.

In another part of the country, in the Diocese of Great Falls-Billings in Montana, 99 parishes and missions are spread over 90,000 square miles. Many priests in the diocese serve multiple parishes, and some serve up to five! Many parishes cannot meet the financial obligations of having a full-time priest, and communities often feel disconnected from the larger Church. With your support of CHMA, the diocese ensures that priests can make the necessary travel to serve their flocks and that parishes can keep their doors open. The support from this appeal has touched the people in this diocese and allowed them to keep their

faith communities active and connected to the universal Church.

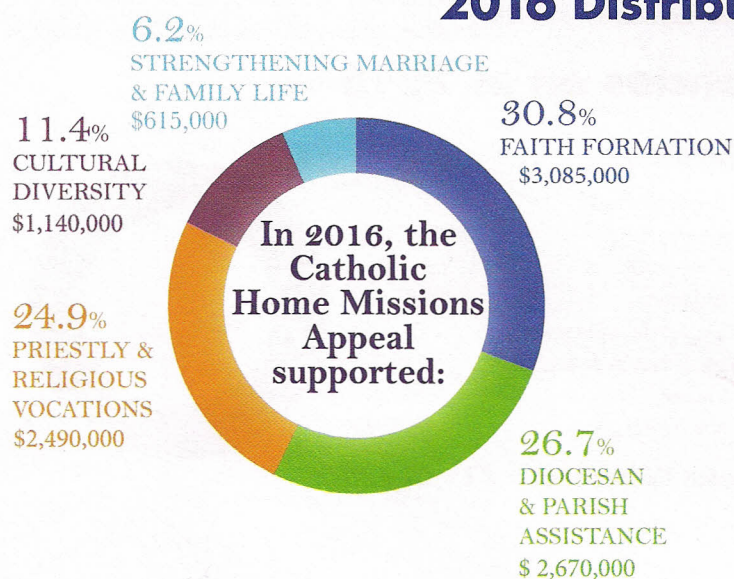

Home mission dioceses are those dioceses in the United States and its territories and former territories that cannot provide basic pastoral services to Catholics without outside help. Basic pastoral services include Mass and the sacraments, religious education, and ministry training for priests, deacons, religious sisters, and lay people. Right now, over 40 percent of dioceses are considered home missions.

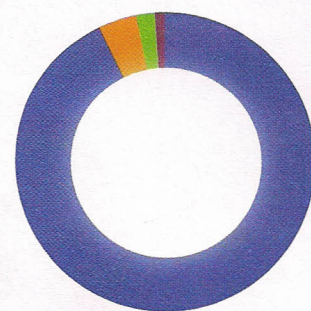
2016 Distribution of Funding

FORTALECIENDO LA IGLESIA EN CASA

La Diócesis de Knoxville en la zona este de Tennessee es, en gran parte, una diócesis rural que muestra el rostro de los pobres de ese lugar. La población hispana se ha más que duplicado en los últimos años y está siendo afectada por la pobreza en forma desproporcionada.

Gracias a su apoyo al Llamado para las Misiones Católicas (CHMA), la diócesis está ampliando sus programas para el ministerio hispano. Con sus contribuciones, se están distribuyendo estampas de oración, brindando capacitación y formación en la fe para el liderazgo hispano y aumentando el número de parroquias que celebra la Misa en español con el fin de integrar y retener a esta población. Una parroquia solo tenía una Misa al mes y la asistencia era baja, de 20 a 50 personas, pero el personal de la parroquia reconoció que la comunidad hispana era grande y que

necesitaba Misas en español. Ahora, todos los domingos, un sacerdote viaja 60 millas para celebrar la Misa en español y la asistencia casi se ha duplicado.

En otro lugar del país, en la Diócesis de Great Falls–Billings, en Montana, 99 parroquias y misiones están diseminadas en más de 90,000 millas cuadradas. Muchos sacerdotes en esa diócesis sirven a múltiples parroquias y algunos sirven hasta a cinco! Muchas parroquias no pueden cumplir con la obligación económica que significa tener a un sacerdote a tiempo completo y, a menudo, las comunidades se sienten desconectadas de la Iglesia en general. Con el apoyo que ustedes le den a CHMA, la diócesis se asegurará que los sacerdotes hagan los viajes necesarios para servir a su rebaño y que las parroquias mantengan sus puertas abiertas. El apoyo dado a este llamado ha alcanzado a personas en esa diócesis y les ha permitido mantener activas a

sus comunidades de fe y conectadas a la Iglesia universal.

Contribuyan al Llamado para las Misiones Católicas y ayuden a mejorar la vida—y la fe—de nuestros hermanos y hermanas en el país.

¿Qué es una diócesis misionera?

Las diócesis misioneras son aquellas diócesis en los Estados Unidos y sus territorios y antiguos territorios que no pueden proveer servicios pastorales básicos a los católicos sin recibir una ayuda externa. Los servicios pastorales básicos incluyen la Misa y los sacramentos, la educación religiosa y la capacitación en el ministerio para sacerdotes, diáconos, religiosas y laicos. Hoy, a más del 40 por ciento de las diócesis se le considera como diócesis misioneras.

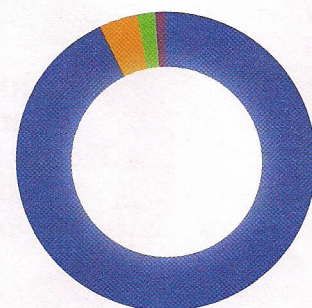
Distribución de los fondos en el 2016

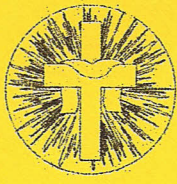
