Do you believe that you have a Father in heaven who wants nothing but what is best for you? The Bible is full of examples of God acting for the good of his people throughout the course of human history. Jesus Christ is the clearest example of this. Fully God, fully man, he came down from heaven and became incarnate of the Virgin Mary to save us from our sins.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church says that God, “tirelessly calls” each one of us to him. (CCC2567) Because God wants what is best for us he gave us the commandments to help us live free, happy and joyful lives. He gives us all the graces and gifts necessary for our salvation, but we have a part to play. We need to dispose ourselves properly to hear him and meet him in the sacraments, especially the Eucharist.

Some Catholics err by viewing the Mass strictly by what they “get” from it. Perhaps, the better question to ask ourselves is, “What am I bringing to Mass?”

What do you bring to Mass? Praise and prayers? Distraction and boredom? Jesus tells us, “Ask, and it will be given you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you.” (Matthew 7:7) Notice that asking, seeking and knocking all require some effort on our part. If you are truly seeking God at Mass, or anywhere else, you have to put in some effort to connect with him. Once your heart moves toward God, you will realize that you aren't pursuing God nearly as hard as he is pursuing you.

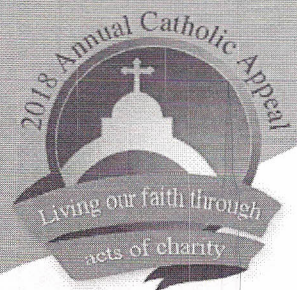

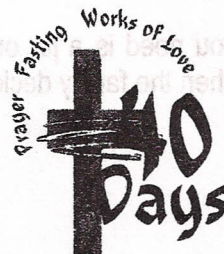

## **Lenten Activities for Families**

### **Prayer:**

**Soup Night Fridays:** Come to Stations of the Cross at on Fridays of Lent and stay to have soup together in the Hall. Donate the money that you would have spent on dinner.

**Pray** the sorrowful mysteries of the rosary together- daily, weekly, whatever works for you. If this feels overwhelming with little ones, try just 1 decade.

**Divine Mercy Novena-** Pray the Novena, beginning Good Friday and join us to celebrate the Feast of Divine Mercy on the Sunday following Easter.

**Mass and Liturgy:** Attend Ash Wednesday, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday services together.

**Confession:** Attend a communal penance service together or go to confession frequently as a family during Lent. Check out our app suggestions for examination of conscience! Join us for our Lenten Penance Service on Wed, Feb. 28<sup>th</sup> at 3:00p.m.

**Lenten Parish Mission:** Our Lenten Mission begins on Monday, Feb. 26 until Wed, Feb. 28<sup>th</sup>. Fr. Luis Runde, OFM from Elfrida will be here to begin our Mission with 8:00a.m. Mass followed by his talk. He will also preach at St. Andrew's Church in the evening at 6:30p.m. each of those days.

### **Fasting:**

**Lent Sacrifice Beans:** Kids put dry beans in a jar for good deeds and sacrifices during Lent. Then on Easter morning, the sacrifice beans turn into jelly beans!

**Printable Lent Sacrifice tags:** <http://teamwhitaker.org/2016/02/lent-made-easy-with-kid-friendly-printables/lent-sacrifices-for-kids/> Put them in a basket and let the kids pick a tag each day for the family to work on. Includes Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving ideas.

**Fasting alternatives:** Give something up for Lent as a family, even if your kids are young enough that they don't "have" to. We always give up candy as a blanket sacrifice, and then decide on other things. Other good "blanket sacrifices" are no music in the car, no eating out, or drinking only water during Lent. Perhaps pick one day a week to go "screen free" as a family.

### **Almsgiving:**

**40 bags, 40 days.** You pick the size of the bag (Paper bag, grocery bag, trash bag, lunch sac) and you go through one drawer, closet, or corner of your house each day and donate one bag. This is an excellent exercise in living simply. If one a day seems too much, try one bag a week!

**Almsgiving Box-** you simply set out a box, and take 1 thing from your own pantry every day of Lent. At the end of Lent, take the box to a food pantry. Don't forget to share the good stuff!



**Offering Jar**– all you need is a jar or piggy bank of some kind. Spare change goes into the jar for the length of Lent, and then the family decides where to donate the money.

**Confession:** this app develops an examination of conscience based on age, sex and vocation and then walks you through the sacrament. (iOS, Android)

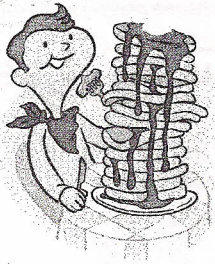
