



CLERGY EDUCATION AND SUPPORT

The *Office of the Chancellor* provides personnel support to the <u>153</u> priests serving in the Diocese, as well as financial support and benefits to <u>45</u> retired priests.

The *Common Formation Program* is currently working with <u>29</u> men who feel called to the Permanent Diaconate and may, one day, join the <u>139</u> deacons currently serving in the Diocese.

SEMINARIAN EDUCATION AND SUPPORT

The Office of Vocations promotes priestly vocations, selects qualified candidates for discernment, coordinates the formation and education of seminarians, provides for the <u>13</u> current seminarians, and presents qualified seminarians for priestly ordination. Seminarian tuition is \$40,000 per year for each seminarian.





PARISH SUPPORT

The *Office of the Tribunal* represents the judicial ministry of the Church and has served <u>978</u> individuals in the last year.

Youth and Young Adult Ministries

19,500 youth and young adults are empowered to live as disciples of Jesus Christ as they participate in the life, mission, and work of the Catholic faith community through any formation offered by the Diocese.

SCHOOLS EDUCATION AND EVANGELIZATION

The Office of Catholic Schools ensures the spiritual and professional development of $\underline{560}$ teachers who serve $\underline{6,973}$ students at the Diocese's $\underline{19}$ elementary and $\underline{6}$ high schools.

The Office of Catechesis and Family Life guides and develops effective Catechetical leadership in the parishes of the Diocese. In the past year, more than <u>355</u> people joined the Catholic faith through the RCIA process and <u>5,000</u> adults participated in formation classes offered by Diocesan personnel.

Diocese of Tucson Catholic Cemetery and Columbarium Rules and Regulations

Effective March 6, 2019

Regulations on Flowers and Decorations

The cemetery or columbarium is a public place; people come and go from dawn to dusk, seven days a week. As a result, we are not able to protect attractive items from theft. In making choices, it is unfortunate, but necessary to keep this in mind.

If you have any questions, please contact the Diocesan cemetery office at 520-888-0860. We appreciate hearing from you. This enables us to review and improve our service to you and all of the families using the cemeteries & columbarium.

Flower and Ornament Policy

Safety is paramount. Decorations need to be safe for those who visit the cemeteries/columbarium and for the maintenance workers and the equipment. To insure this, all items need to be placed in an approved vase which can be purchased at the Parish office. Floral arrangements CAN NOT be taller than 4 inches once in the vase & cannot infringe upon any surrounding niches. Ceramic photo tiles of loved ones must be ordered & purchased at the Parish office. Glass, pottery, statuary, photographs or memorabilia are not permitted on, or adjacent to, any burial space, crypt, tree, landscaped area, or any memorial, monument, feature or statuary. Items such as glass, pottery and metal are always removed as soon as they are observed.

Open flames are prohibited in any of the cemeteries. This includes such items as candles, fires or barbecues.

Decoration Removal

Decorations may be removed under any of the following conditions.

- Each year, on the last week of January and the last week of July, for general clean-up. Please mark these days on your family calendar.
- Seasonal decorations will be removed ten days after major holidays.
- When cemetery rules and regulations are violated.

- At certain times of the year, as the desert southwest experiences high winds and torrential rains, flowers may be blown from vases.
- The cemetery reserves the right to remove all flowers and decorations when they become withered or unsightly. The grounds superintendent will make removals when they impede normal grounds maintenance.

American Flag Display and Removal Policy

The Diocese of Tucson Catholic Cemeteries adheres to the following guidelines regarding the display, care and removal of the American flag.

- The American flag, in miniature, may be displayed on the grave, niche or crypt front and needs to be placed in an approved floral container.
- The American flag must be displayed in such a way as to ensure it is not desecrated in the process of display not touch the ground or become soiled. If it becomes wet, it must be dry before being stored.
- If a flag becomes soiled or torn, it must be removed and properly disposed of (burned). This is the responsibility of maintenance personnel.
- The American flag will never be treated as waste or debris by maintenance personnel. When necessary, flags will be removed by maintenance personnel and disposed of properly. If you wish to retain your flag, you must remove it at the first sign of it being torn or dirty.
- State flags, Nation flags, Organization flags or decorative flags are not permitted without written authorization and approval by the Executive Director of the Cemeteries.

Regulations - Landscaping and Planting

The Diocese of Tucson Catholic Cemeteries adheres to the following guidelines regarding landscaping, plants and materials.

- No landscaping, plants or materials are to be removed or added to the cemetery grounds without written authorization by the Executive Director of the cemeteries.
- Unauthorized planting will be removed.
- Any person or person(s) removing or moving landscaping plants or materials from the cemetery grounds is subject to arrest by local law agencies.
- The digging of holes for any purpose whatsoever, other than by cemetery employees, is strictly prohibited.
- Ornaments, such as plastic decorations, pinwheels, animal figurines, balloons, etc. are not permitted.
