

Why Forty Weekdays before Easter?

The time of forty days for Lent is Biblical. The Israelites wandered in the desert for forty years and Jesus spent forty days in the desert during which time he was tempted by the the devil before he began his earthly ministry.

So each year the church observes Lent for forty days where we also are tested. We participate in abstinence, times of fasting, confession, and acts of mercy to strengthen our faith and discipline. The goal is, of course, for every Christian to leave Lent a stronger person of faith with a heart more in love with Our Lord.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states, "The seasons and days of penance in the course of the liturgical year (Lent, and each Friday in memory of the death of the Lord) are intense moments of the Church's penitential practice. These times are particularly appropriate for spiritual exercises, penitential liturgies and pilgrimages as signs of penance, voluntary self-denial such as fasting and almsgiving, and fraternal sharing (charitable and missionary works,)" CCC1438
