



SAINT PHILIP NERI (1515-1595) **May 26**

In a shop near the Vatican, a group of Americans laughed as the shopkeeper showed off his fluent English and latest souvenir, a key ring whose papal portrait, when pressed, activated a recorded blessing. Through the shop window, two clerics scowled disapproval. The shopkeeper grunted, "They're a very somber order who've left the Church. I recognize them." "By their long robes?" an American asked. "Many in Rome wear robes," replied the shopkeeper. "It's their long faces!" When Philip Neri arrived in sixteenth-century Rome, there was reason to be somber. Swiss Guards had been massacred on Saint Peter's steps defending the pope. Parts of Europe were abandoning the Church. But Philip resolved to be an "apostle of joy," drawing especially the young to Christ-and frequent confession and Communion-by his sincere interest in their problems, prayerful example, and gentle humor. His "Oratory," a movement as well as a place, provided recreation and devotion in a joyful atmosphere of companionship, service, and liturgy. Philip Neri challenges each of us to begin improving Church and world by changing ourselves with unfailing joy.





FROM THE DESK OF FR. MIKE.....

PHASE 1 REOPENING OF THE CHURCH

Under the directive of the Bishop and the Diocese of Tucson, we are planning for Phase 1 of having public Masses.

Parking lot Masses to begin on the weekend of May 30 & 31st. Mass times may be adjusted due to weather & heat.

As a reminder that the Sunday Mass obligation is suspended for everyone until further notice. Your safety and the safety of all is the main concern during this time. Dear Brothers and Sisters,

We have been notified by Bishop Weisenburger that we will be able to celebrate public masses at our parish beginning with the vigil of Pentecost on May 30. Mass times have changed so please look below.

Please read the following carefully. They are the requirements to make our liturgies as safe as we reasonably can. Also, please remember that these are **just the first steps** to fully opening our parish church.

Due to the continuing presence of the Covid-19 virus in our community there is an **inherent risk**, **regardless of age or health**, **in attending any public event**. **This includes religious services**. While we are working to reduce the risk, there are no risk-free situations. A parishioner's presence at a public event constitutes his or her understanding and acceptance of this essential level of risk.

The decision to return to the public celebrations of our faith during this time of pandemic should not be made casually or lightly by anyone.

The Sunday Mass obligation has been suspended indefinitely for all Catholics living in or visiting the Tucson Diocese. No one is required to return to receive Holy Communion or return to in-person Masses at this time.

Those age 65 or older, as well as anyone with a chronic health condition, are strongly urged to remain at home and not come onto church premises. This is a time when such persons should let the church come to them in perhaps a secondary but still meaningful way -- via the internet, television, and other means of technology. (The 10 a.m. live-streamed mass at St. Andrew's will continue indefinitely; other masses are listed on our parish web page.)

Anyone feeling ill in any way is urged, in the strongest sense, to remain at home and not risk accidental harm to the community gathered at church or other public places.

In light of this, Our Lady of the Mountains will begin the public celebration of Mass on the Vigil of Pentecost, Saturday, May 30 with **drive-in masses in our parking lot.** This will enable many of our parishioners to participate in the liturgy without leaving the safety of their vehicles.

Here is how we will accomplish this: Mass schedule will be as follows: Saturday Vigil Mass at **6:30 p.m.** (later to keep us cooler) Sunday: 7:30 a.m.; 9:30 a.m. and 11:30 a.m. (Spanish) There will be no Sunday evening mass at first.

When you arrive in your vehicle volunteers will direct you to a parking spot. We will be spacing the vehicles to maintain correct social distancing. You are required to remain in that vehicle for the duration of the mass except as outlined below. Please note that the church restrooms and drinking fountains will not be available during this phase of re-opening. Please bring face masks and hand sanitizer with you. Your wearing of masks helps protect the priests and ministers, so please show your support by wearing a mask when your window is down,

You will be able to hear the mass by tuning your car radio to 105.3 FM.

Ushers will take the collection only once by bringing around a basket into which you can drop your offering(s). Please wear you mask any time your car window is open. We still strongly recommend you use online giving which is safer for all. If you have already given online, just leave your window rolled up as the usher comes by.

Communion will be distributed using the following protocols:

- i. It will take place after the final blessing and dismissal.
- ii. The Faithful are to exit their car but remain next to the car for the reception of Holy Communion. The Ministers of Holy Communion will come to each individual car with the Eucharist. This is the only time parishioners may exit their car.
- iii. Please wear your mask while waiting. Also the use of hand sanitizer before exiting your vehicle is encouraged.
- iv. Hand sanitizer will be available for special ministers of the Eucharist.
- v. Communion will be received only on the hand.
- vi. Due to the number of people who may have physical difficulty, we may need to have some remain seated in their vehicles and receive holy communion through the window. This would be by exception. Please let the minister know.
- vii. Once you have received Holy Communion, please return immediately to your vehicle and follow the instructions of our traffic volunteers.

Sunday bulletins will not be handed out. We will continue to email them to you. Please keep us up to date with your contact information by calling the parish office at 378-3720 so that we can send you bulletins as well as to inform you of any changes. These instructions are subject to change as circumstance change.

Please continue to pray for our priests and our parish community.

Queridos Hermanos,

El Obispo Weisenburger nos ha notificado que podremos celebrar misas públicas en nuestra parroquia a partir de la Vigilia de Pentecostés el 30 de Mayo. Los horarios para las misas han cambiado, así que por favor mire a continuación.

Por favor, lea atentamente lo siguiente. Son los requisitos para hacer que nuestras liturgias sean lo más seguras posible. Además, recuerde que estos son solo los primeros pasos para abrir completamente nuestra parroquia.

Debido a la presencia continua del virus Covid-19 en nuestra comunidad existe un riesgo inherente, independientemente de la edad o la salud, al asistir a cualquier evento público. Esto incluye los servicios religiosos. Mientras trabajamos para reducir el riesgo, no hay situaciones libres de riesgos. La presencia de la feligresía en un evento público constituye su comprensión y aceptación de este nivel esencial de riesgo. La decisión de volver a las celebraciones públicas de nuestra Fe durante este tiempo de pandemia no debe ser tomada casual o a la ligera por nadie.

La obligación de la Misa Dominical ha sido suspendida indefinidamente para todos los Católicos que viven o visitan la Diócesis de Tucson. Nadie está obligado a regresar para recibir la Santa Comunión o volver a las Misas en persona en este momento.

Aquellas personas mayores de 65 años, así como cualquier persona con una condición de salud crónica, se les insta encarecidamente a permanecer en casa y no venir a las instalaciones de la iglesia. Este es un momento en el que esas personas deben dejar que la Iglesia vaya a ellos tal vez de una manera secundaria pero todavía significativa -- a través de Internet, la televisión y otros medios de tecnología. La misa transmitida en vivo en Ingles a las 10 a.m. en San Andres, continuará indefinidamente; otras misas están anunciadas en la página de internet de nuestra parroquia.

Personas que se sientan enfermos, se les pide encarecidamente que permanezcan en casa para no poner en riesgo su salud y la salud de la comunidad reunida en la parroquia u otros lugares públicos.

A la luz de esto, Nuestra Sra. de las Montañas comenzará la celebración pública de la misa en la Vigilia de Pentecostés, Sábado 30 de Mayo, con misas en nuestro estacionamiento. Esto permitirá a muchos de nuestros feligreses participar en la liturgia sin dejar la seguridad en sus vehículos.

Así es como lograremos esto:

Los horarios de las misas serán lo siguiente:

Sábado: Misa de Vigilia a las 6:30 p.m. (Ingles) (*más tarde para mantenernos más frescos*) Domingo: 7:30 a.m. (Ingles); 9:30 a.m. (Ingles) y 11:30 a.m. (Español)

No habrá misa el Domingo por la tarde.

Cuando llegue en su vehículo al estacionamiento de la iglesia, los voluntarios lo dirigirán a un lugar para estacionarse. Estaremos espaciando los vehículos para mantener el distanciamiento social correcto. Usted está obligado a permanecer en su vehículo durante la duración de la misa, excepto como se describe a continuación. Tenga en cuenta que los baños de la iglesia y las fuentes para beber agua no estarán disponibles durante esta fase de reapertura. Por favor, traiga máscaras faciales y desinfectante de manos con usted. Su uso de máscaras ayudara a proteger a los sacerdotes, diáconos, y ministros, así que por favor muestre su apoyo usando una máscara cuando su ventana este abajo.

Usted podrá escuchar la misa sintonizando la radio de su vehículo a 105.3 FM.

Los ujieres tomarán la colecta una sola vez trayendo una canasta en la que puedes dejar caer tu donación. Por favor, use su máscara cada vez que la ventana de su vehículo esté abierta. Le recomendamos que utilice la página de internet de Nuestra Sra. De Las Montañas para mandar sus donaciones y ayudar mantener el distanciamiento entre personas.

La comunión se distribuirá utilizando los siguientes protocolos:

- 1. Tendrá lugar después de la bendición final y el despido.
- 2. Los fieles deben salir de su vehículo, pero permanecer al lado del vehículo para la recepción de la Santa Comunión. Los ministros de la Santa Comunión llegarán a cada vehículo individual con la Eucaristía. Esta es la única vez que los feligreses pueden salir de su vehículo.
- 3. Por favor, use su máscara mientras espera. También se recomienda el uso del desinfectante de manos antes de salir de su vehículo.
- 4. El desinfectante de manos estará disponible para los ministros extraordinarios de la Comunión.
- 5. La Comunión se recibirá solamente en la mano.
- 6. Personas que tengan dificultades físicas, pueden permanecer en sus vehículos para recibir la Santa Comunión a través de la ventana. Esto será por excepción. Por favor, háganselo saber al ministro de la Comunión.
- 7. Una vez que haya recibido la Santa Comunión, por favor regrese inmediatamente a su vehículo y siga las instrucciones de nuestros voluntarios de tráfico.

Los boletines dominicales no se entregarán. Continuaremos enviándolos por correo electrónico. Por favor, manténganos al día con su información de contacto llamando a la oficina parroquial al 378-3720 para que podamos enviarle boletines con información de cualquier cambio. Estas instrucciones están sujetas a cambios a medida que cambian las circunstancias.

Por favor, continúen orando por nuestros sacerdotes, diáconos y nuestra comunidad parroquial.
