



Going to college or a trade school? Plan on continuing your Catholic Faith journey while you do so? You may be eligible for the St. Andrew the Apostle Scholarship Endowment award. The St. Andrew the Apostle Scholarship Endowment (SAASE) will award \$1,000.00 scholarships to students from the Sierra Vista area that are enrolled, or are enrolling in an institution of higher learning in 2022/23.

Eligibility: Open to confirmed members of St. Andrew the Apostle Parish in Sierra Vista or another Roman Catholic Church in the greater Sierra Vista area who are enrolled, or are enrolling in an institute of higher learning (community college, post-high school vocational school, technical college, university, etc.). 




