





Prayer Before a Crucifix

Look down upon me, good and gentle Jesus while before your face I humbly kneel, and with burning soul pray and beseech you to fix deep in my heart lively sentiments of faith, hope, and charity; true contrition for my sins, and a firm purpose of amendment.

While I contemplate with great love and pity, your five most precious wounds, pondering over them within me, I call to mind the words which David, your prophet, said of you, my good Jesus: "They have pierced my hands and my feet, they have numbered all my bones."

Going to college or a trade school? Plan on continuing your Catholic Faith journey while you do so? You may be eligible for the St. Andrew the Apostle Scholarship Endowment award. The St. Andrew the Apostle Scholarship Endowment (SAASE) will award \$1,000.00 scholarships to students from the Sierra Vista area that are enrolled or are enrolling in an institution of higher learning in 2023/24.

Eligibility: Open to confirmed members of St. Andrew the Apostle Parish in Sierra Vista or another Roman Catholic Church in the greater Sierra Vista area who are enrolled or are enrolling in an institute of higher learning (community college, post-high school vocational school, technical college, university, etc.). Students need not attend a Catholic institute of higher learning to receive the funds. The recipient must be a Confirmed Catholic in good standing with the Church.

How to Apply: To apply - follow the instructions on the checklist below. Fill out and sign the form at the end of this letter and include it with your packet. You will be competing with other candidates for the scholarship. Application packets are also available at the parish offices at St. Andrew the Apostle, Our Lady of the Mountains, Holy Family Catholic Community, and Sacred Heart Catholic Church. An online application form may be emailed to you at your request to thad.a.larson@gmail.com.

Value: The value of the total scholarship varies from year to year; typically, the value has been \$1,000.00. Depending on the available funds, the SAASE Committee will select the most qualified and deserving recipient(s). Often the amount is awarded to two or more recipients. The total available funds for the scholarship may be divided among an appropriate number of recipients as determined by the committee, or awarded to a single individual as circumstances dictate.

Deadline: You may submit your application packet online to thad.a.larson@gmail.com. The deadline for online submissions is **May 5**, 2023. We request that all attachments are done in PDF format. Digital signatures are accepted. All letters of recommendation MUST be signed either digitally or physically. Scanning letters of recommendations is acceptable as long as they are in PDF format.

You may also mail your packet. Applications must be postmarked or hand delivered to Thad Larson no later than **May 5, 2023**.





Cerca de un millón de refugiados de Sudán del Sur hoy se albergan en Uganda, donde muchos de ellos viven en el campamento de refugiados Bidi Bidi, al norte de Uganda. Para Jimmy Luate, su esposa Jackie v su hija Stella, Bidi Bidi es su nuevo hogar desde que huyeron de la guerra en el 2016. Catholic Relief Services, a



través de un programa integral de construcción de viviendas, capacitación en prácticas de higiene y desarrollo de liderazgo—ha ayudado limmy a convertirse en un líder y defensor de las familias de refugiados más necesitadas.




