While we might see the work of the Father, Son, or Holy Spirit more distinctly in particular situations (the Father in Creation, the Son on the Cross, the Spirit at Pentecost), you can never divorce one from the other: "Because it does not divide the divine unity, the real distinction of the Persons from one another resides solely in the relationships which relate them to one another" (CCC, 255).
